COVID PROTOCOLS

- Our Lady of Peace Catholic School (OLP) strongly encourages mask use for all people when indoors in school settings, especially when physical distancing is not possible.
 Masks are NOT mandated.
- Students, faculty, and staff that are showing signs of COVID-19 or any other illness are
 required to stay home. Development of COVID symptoms while at school will result in (at
 minimum) the individual being isolated until capable of being sent home, contract tracing
 taking place, and immediate sanitation of the space(s) utilized by the individual prior to
 developing symptoms.
- Large space HEPA air purifiers and hand sanitizer stations are located in every classroom, office, and meeting space.
- Staggered lunch periods.
- Continued 1:1 device ratio within our 5K 8th grade classes to assist with a transition to our online learning portal if we are to transition to a digital learning environment.
- Additional COVID specific cleaning and disinfecting actions by our custodial company on a daily and weekly basis.
- Any student, faculty, or staff which tests positive with COVID or has had a confirmed case
 of close contact with someone who was/is positive will follow the DHEC & diocesan
 isolation and quarantine protocols. Contact tracing and the required sanitation and
 disinfecting of the contaminated space will take place following any confirmed positive
 case of COVID or close contact with someone who was/is positive with COVID.
- All adults wishing to enter the building MUST wear a mask.



DROP-OFF AND PICK-UP REMINDERS

Drop-Off

We kindly ask that the first car to pull in by Murphy Hall pull all the way up to the orange cones so that we can fit as many cars in that area as possible.

Drop-off will continue to take place from <u>7:45am to 8:15am</u>. Instruction will begin promptly at 8:20AM. Students will be tardy if they are not in their classrooms by 8:20am. Any students arriving after this time will need to buzz in through the front door and come to the School Office for a tardy slip.

For safety, all parents should remain in their vehicles. In the mornings we have Miss Garrison, Ms. Pam, and Ms. Parr outside to assist your children out of the car and safely into the building. Once inside, we have faculty and student helpers walking all 4K-1st grade students to their classrooms. Waiting to watch them walk inside the building holds up the carline, so please be courteous to those behind you.

If you have a student in a car seat or booster seat, please help facilitate faster drop-off and pick-up by making sure it is located in the center, or **right** side of the back of your vehicle. The driveway located by the ramp at the front entrance to the school is not for parking or waiting. This spot needs to remain open, and unobstructed. This area is for persons who need access to our ramp, deliveries, and emergency vehicles only. If you need to wait for a student to come out, please use the spots facing the playground.


Pick-Up

Pick-up will take place in the Large Parking Lot. Please park in line of other vehicles facing the numbers painted on the ground. We ask that all parents remain in their vehicles. Once students are escorted out of the school by their teachers all traffic into and out of the campus will be stopped by school staff. Late arrivals will need to wait to drive in, and must wait until all cars are dismissed.

Once all students are accounted for and in vehicles, traffic will be allowed to depart the parking lot in an orderly fashion. Students WILL NOT be allowed to jump into vehicles that are

not parked in the Large Parking Lot. Late vehicles will need to wait for all traffic to depart the parking lot prior to pulling into the area to pick up their child.

Rainy day pick-up will take place adjacent to Murphy Hall just as daily drop-off takes place. Parents of 4K students have car line priority on all pick-up days. If you are in line, please allow the parents of these students to move to the front of the line.



Keeping Your Kids Safe

Vehicle Safety

Please adhere to state guidelines to keep your children safe!

South Carolina Child Passenger Safety Law



Rear-Facing Car Seat

An infant under 2 must be secured in a rear-facing car seat in a rear seat of the vehicle until the child exceeds the height or weight limit allowed by the manufacturer of the car seat.



Forward-Facing Car Sea

A child at least age 2 or under 2 who has outgrown the manufacturer's height or weight limits for a rear-facing car seat must be secured in a forward-facing car seat in a rear seat of the vehicle until the child exceeds the highest height or weight requirements of the forward-facing car seat.



Booster Sea

Children at least age 4 who have outgrown their forward-facing car seat must be secured by a booster seat in a rear seat of the vehicle until the child can meet the height and fit requirements for an adult safety seat belt. Lap and shoulder belts must be used.



eat Belt

A child at least age 8 or at least 57 inches tall may be restrained by an adult safety belt if the child can be secured properly by an adult safety seat belt.

- 1. **Get Organized.** Making a plan for what you're going to do and when you're going to do it will make sure you're always ahead of the curve literally.
- 2. Don't multitask. Studies have shown that multitasking is physically impossible.
- 3. **Divide it up.** Studying isn't fun to begin with, and forcing yourself through a study marathon will only make it worse. Dividing your work into manageable chunks and rewarding yourself when you finish each chunk will make studying (more) fun.
- 4. **Sleep.** Don't underestimate the importance of those eight hours of zzz's every night!

 Getting a good night's rest will sharpen your focus and improve your working memory.

- 5. **Set a schedule.** Do you work better right after school or after you've eaten dinner? Are you more productive in 90-minute blocks or half-hour spurts? Find a schedule that works for you, and stick to it.
- 6. **Take notes**. Taking notes will not only keep you more engaged during class, but will also help you narrow down what you need to study when exam time rolls around. It's much easier to reread your notes than to reread your entire textbook!
- 7. **Study.** This one might be obvious, but did you know that there's a right and a wrong way to study? Review your material several days ahead of time, in small chunks, and in different manners (for example, write flashcards one day and take practice tests the next). In other words, don't cram.
- 8. **Manage your study space.** Find a place that will maximize your productivity. Look for places away from the television and other distractions. Whether it's your local library or just the desk in your bedroom, set aside a study space that you'll want to spend time in.
- 9. **Find a study group.** Sitting down with a group of people who are learning the same things as you is a great way to go over confusing class material or prepare for a big test. You can quiz each other, reteach material, and make sure that everyone is on the same page. After all, teaching someone else is the best way to learn.
- 10. **Ask questions.** You're in school to learn, so don't be afraid to do just that! Asking for help from a teacher, a tutor or your friends is a surefire way to make sure you truly understand the material.

Dear Middle School Parents,

I want to provide the school community an update of what has transpired and is taking place regarding both the Middle School Religion teaching position (vacancy) and why we are currently still using the Chromebooks from years past.

MS Religion Vacancy

At the conclusion of last year our long-time middle school religion teacher, Mrs. Cathy Brown, retired after three decades of teaching in public and parochial schools. Our Lady of Peace was fortunate enough to have Mrs. Ference, a highly qualified candidate, apply for and accept the position in the spring. Mrs. Ference relocated to the CSRA with her husband who was recently stationed at Fort Gordon, and she was able to begin her preparation and planning for this upcoming school year in early June. The Ference family discovered that they were pregnant a few weeks prior to the beginning of the school year, but unfortunately, Mrs. Ference experienced some severe complications and had to be hospitalized two days before school began. She and her child, while they both feared for their lives, are both now in the clear and doing much better. Unfortunately, Mrs. Ference had to resign her position due to the long-term complications that accompany her situation.

Up to this point, Kayla Sherlock and I have instructed middle school religion to provide the long-term sub time to accomplish the required diocesan paperwork (background screening) in order to begin teaching. The long-term sub will be Ms. Theresa Gorman. We are still looking for a permanent replacement for Mrs. Ference so please pass the word and contact the School Office if you have any individuals who are interested in the position. A college degree and an active Catholic in good standing are required and experience in religious education or teaching is preferred.

Chromebooks

The school applied for and has received approval for the Emergency Assistance for Non-Public Schools (EANS) initiative in the spring. Part of our package we submitted to the state included a request to replace our old middle school Chromebooks with newer versions of the device. The state has approved our request but unfortunately, everything is out of our hands at this time and all we can do is wait for the state and the third-party vendor to get us our devices.

Parents Entering the Building

Due to the rise in COVID cases throughout our area, we will reinstate a protocol that we had in place last year – parents picking up or dropping off children, lunches, supplies, paperwork, etc. will be met at the front door by office personnel rather than be allowed to walk to the office. Only individuals coming to the office to make a cash payment (CC can be accomplished over the phone) will be allowed entry during the school day (this excludes school volunteers or parents who have appointments with the administration). While inside the school, we request that all visitors wear a mask. Employees, volunteers, and students have all accepted liability (Diocesan COVID waiver) if they chose to not wear a mask in the building.

I appreciate everyone's patience and understanding in these matters.

Dear Parents, Teachers and Staff,

RE: Masks for School Children, Teachers and Staff

On August 5, 2021, Bishop Guglielmone published a letter to the Diocese concerning the spread of COVID-19 virus and the delta variant. In his letter he strongly encouraged that masks be worn, but left the decision with the Pastor. He also asked us to respect local ordinances and directives from the CDC and South Carolina government officials. In his latest guidance on wearing masks, Governor McMaster has said that wearing masks in South Carolina will continue to be a personal choice.

On July 23, 2021, Life Site News published a report that showing that 47 studies confirm the ineffectiveness of masks for COVID and 32 more studies confirm their negative health effects. The social teaching of the Church is based on the human person as the principle, subject and object of every social organization. Subsidiarity is one of the core principles of this teaching. This principle holds that human affairs are best handled at the lowest possible level, closest to the affected persons.

With that in mind, the parents of our students will be the ones who will decide whether or not their child is to wear a mask. Teachers and staff personnel will make their own personal choice as to wearing a mask.
